Coming in second are the Southport Seagulls, captained by Sophie Temple. The seagulls had a great season in 2022, earning crucial points against their main competition, Sefton Sharks. In the off season, The Seagulls gained a small handful of talented players and are looking a stronger contender for the 2023 season.

The third and final team in Merseyside's only softball league are The Liverpool Trojans. The Trojans are a newly formed team who are about to start their third season of softball. Captain David Martin Baez formed the club from Liverpool Trojans Baseball Club in 2021 and his team are on the hunt for glory in the 2023 season after recruiting some players during indoor training over the winter.







## **LIVERPOOL SHIELD 2023**

Liverpool Softball League got off to a flying start before the season had even begun with the start of the Liverpool Shield Tournament, which is following on from the previous years tournaments.

The tournament was a huge success, with teams from all over the UK competing for the Shield, Plate and Spoon. The weather was hot and sunny, providing a perfect backdrop for a weekend of exciting softball action. The scorching tournament went down well in Widnes. The players didn't let the heat get to them, as they were too busy trying to hit home-runs and catch fly-balls. With the help of a few pints, the players kept their cool, and started to play their game. The weekend was one to remember, even if we had too many sunburns to show for it!

The tournament featured some strong teams from all over Britains mainland, all vying for the top prize. The competition was fierce, with each team playing their hearts out to win. In the end, Cardiff took the Shield back to South Wales as the tournaments winners! They put up an extremely strong performance on the first day, winning all 5 of their games against the Bombers, Seagulls, Bolts, Dales and Drizzle. On the second day they dominated in the final against a talented runner up, Swindon Bombers. The game finished 28-5 to Cardiff, with Sian and Jamie getting the MVP award in the final. In the plate final we saw Yorkshire Dales emerge as winners against The Kelpies in their game that closely finished 18-12. A great game between two very different teams brought entertainment to both the players and spectators. The game was a back and forth affair, with both teams trading runs throughout the game. Pinpoint pitching from Yorkshires' Fletch helped bring his team to victory, as he also won MVP in the game too. An amazing MVP performance from Jane who plays for the Dales also helped her team secure the win in the tightly scored final. Although the Kelpies came close to winning The Plate, its worth mentioning their dedication to tournament as they travelled down from Scotland for the weekend.

Finally, in the Spoon final we saw a local derby, with Liverpool Trojans facing Southport Seagulls. It's safe to say that the Liverpool Trojans put in a dominant display in the spoon final, thrashing the Seagulls 28-6. The Trojans came out swinging, scoring early and commanding the lead. The Seagulls fought hard to get back into the game, but the Trojans' defence was too strong. It was a great win for the Trojans, who played with skill and determination throughout the game. A shoutout is needed for Karthik and Kate for winning the MVP award in the final, and congratulations to the Trojans for winning the Spoon Final!

### **Trojans' Late Late Show at Liverpool Shield**

"Better late than never"...the Trojans certainly put that saying to the test at the Liverpool Shield last weekend. The Trojans, who were the defending Rec champions having won in 2022, were considered amongst the favourites for the Shield this year...at least certainly by me. A good mix of young, old and slightly older teammates with baseball players and seasoned softballers.

The line-up looked to have plenty of runs in it. Trojan Ash, Di, Gina, Pete, Karthik and Rolf were supplemented by Sharks Jo, Kate and Meg with Trojan baseball player Terry and two-sport Bleasy completing the team.

Initial optimism was replaced by crushing realism early on Saturday morning when an impressive Kelpies team took a no-nonsense, disciplined approach to despatch the champs 11-1. Pete had taken the on the pitching duties but was always going to struggle to get the win as we managed only 3 hits in the last 3 innings.

The Bobcats were next and our bats woke from their Saturday slumber with 12 runs. This was not quite enough, losing 13-12, despite a late last inning rally. Determined to maintain our momentum from this game, our next opponents, the Stingers, felt the full Trojan wrath. A 15-run second inning gave pitcher Bleasy a big lead to defend and he did so comfortably allowing only 5 runs for a final 20-5 score. A new dawn for the Trojans, the machine was now well and truly oiled and ready to defeat all in its path on the way to retaining the title, right?

Sadly no. For the next 5 games we fell frustratingly short with narrow defeats and runs that came a bit too late. There were narrow 1-run losses to Bats and Dales despite 7 and 5 last inning runs respectively. Comprehensive defeats followed against Bam, Drizzle and Bolts although our combined 17 last inning runs made the scorelines look slightly more competitive. If this had been league play with 7 inning games, things could have been different but the nature of tournament play was that we had to strike early in time-limited games and this we did not.

Pessimism now prevailed; any glimmers of hope had been well and truly dashed by the time of the Spoon semi-final. We were playing the Bam again who had swept passed us 15-11 in the round-robin stage. A 13-run top of the first inning as we batted round, meant that the game was all but over as a contest with any pessimism now transferred to the shell-shocked Bams. An 8-run second inning showed that the first inning had not been a fluke, with the rest of the game proving a formality finishing 25-5.

It was created as a variation to baseball, which was physically easier and less demanding, making it more accessible to people of all ages and skill levels. Slow-pitch softball is played with a larger ball than baseball, making it easier to hit and catch.
